South Wales Mark Benevolent Fund Supports Prostate Cymru

nfortunately, WBro Robert Murphy, earlier this year, was diagnosed with Prostate Cancer. During one of his visits to hospital and speaking to his consultant Mr Andy Thomas, he was told that Mr Thomas had founded a new charity called Prostate Cymru.

The charity was hoping to construct a specialist large vehicle which would be driven around Wales informing, raising awareness and testing men for signs of Prostate cancer. Funding was also needed to provide the running costs to man the vehicle.

Robert approached his own Craft Lodge, Afon Dar No.8829, for a donation. He also contacted other Lodges in Aberdare and surrounding area. These, too, also kindly donated funds. As a Past Master of Cynon Dare Mark Lodge, he spoke to WBro Gareth Andrews, Provincial Charity Steward of the Mark Province of South Wales, who suggested that he could apply to the South Wales Mark Master Masons Benevolent Fund. On receiving the application, a meeting was held with the Trustees and they

supported the application with a generous cheque for £500.00.

On his next visit to his consultant, the cheque for Prostate Cymru was handed to Mr Thomas. Prostate Cymru is the leading prostate health charity in Wales supporting men with benign prostate disease and prostate cancer. This charity was founded due to the high number of males who discover they have prostate issues.

The charity has no national or government funding, relying upon the kindness and generosity of its fundraisers and volunteers to fulfil its core aims:

1. Raising awareness of prostate cancer and prostate diseases, educating men in Wales about the diseases and their risk. Prostate cancer affects one in eight men in Wales and the risk increases to one in three if there is a family history of the disease. Their awareness team provide free of charge workplace awareness sessions and talks to other groups.



2. Supporting treatments and improving equipment for prostate diseases. To date they have supported Green Light Laser treatment for benign prostate disease and funded the training of surgeons using the Da Vinci robot for minimally invasive prostate cancer surgery.

3. Funding research and innovation across Wales to ensure that men in Wales suffering with prostate diseases will have access to the best available treatments from the NHS in Wales.

Centenary Celebrations at St Illtyds Mark Lodge

by : *Gary Hurst* **hursday, 22 June 2023 was an auspicious day in** the history of St Illtyde Mark Lodge No 784 being

the history of St Illtyds Mark Lodge, No.784, being their 100th Anniversary, and to mark the event, an emergency meeting was called to celebrate the occasion.

The Provincial Grand Master RWBro Thomas Richard Eirian Jones and his Executive Team were in attendance and the highlight of the evening was the Provincial Secretary WBro Martin A Jones reading aloud the 'New Warrant' and the Provincial Grand Master presenting the Warrant and Anniversary Jewel to the Worshipful Master of the Lodge, WBro Nicholas Cocco.





The Senior Past Master of the Lodge WBro Peter Glyn Jones then presented a short history which was very well received. St Illtyd Mark Lodge received its warrant on 29 January 1923, and was Consecrated at Carmarthen on 21 June 1923. Carmarthen being the home of Mansel Mark Lodge, the earliest warranted Mark Lodge in the Province. The fact that the Consecration did not take place in Pontyclun underlines once again the inadequacies of the Ivor Arms. Within less than two years St Illtyd Mark accompanied Trisant and was transferred to the Old National School in School Street (the other side of the station), on the site where the medical centre is situated today.

There were twenty-four Founder Members of the new Lodge, the majority being members in the Craft of either Trisant or the Ogmore Lodge No.1752 in Bridgend.

It would appear that the sponsoring Lodge may have been the Langley Mark Lodge in Cardiff, as the senior Founders included John Rees, D Pugh Jones and W Games Evans, all Past Masters of Langley Lodge. *Continued over*

The first Worshipful Master was Emile Wautier who had been the second WM of Trisant in 1921/22. The Junior Warden in that first Lodge was a Scottish doctor from Llandaff by the name of John McGregor who was destined to become one of the greatest Mark Masons in South Wales.

Despite the great interest shown in Freemasonry in Trisant, which quickly grew to a membership of over one hundred, St Illtyd rarely exceeded more than forty members in the first twenty years of its existence. It would appear that it was a fairly selective Lodge, where almost all the advanced Brethren were professional people of some standing in the community. For example, in the years between 1934 and 1939 only18 Brethren were Advanced and these included two medical practitioners, four schoolmasters, three accountants, a farmer and the Town Clerk of Llantrisant Council.

History of Mark The friendly Degree

he Mark Degree is under the control of the Grand Lodge of Mark Master Masons of England and Wales and its Districts and Lodges Overseas. It has many similar associations with the old operative system of Freemasonry. The ritual is founded upon ancient Craft legends of this operative system and reflects portions of Biblical History that are far earlier than other degrees.

It deals with events before or at the building of King Solomons Temple and the problems that arose during its construction. It was found necessary to ensure completeness and perfect accuracy in all departments of the work and to establish a system of grades amongst the vast number of workmen employed, under which each member of each grade marked his work with some particular mark or symbol thereby enabling the overseers to know the hand which prepared each particular piece of work.



Thus a very early system for 'Quality Control' and ensuring value for money was established. In the old Guilds the Ceremony of selecting and registering a Mark by newly admitted Craftsmen was second in importance only to that of his first admission into the Society.

The Masons' Marks on ecclesiastical buildings are of great antiquity. We are informed that the Cathedral Church of Aberdeen founded in 1357 has upon it Masons' Marks from the foundation upwards.

Mark Degree is one of encouragement and the ritual is built on a single verse from Psalm 118. "The stone which the builders rejected has become the head of the corner".

It illustrates that the wisest of men can be mistaken and that experts are often wrong, that the weakest can display perseverance far better than the strongest and that we all have a part to play in the building of life. It demonstrates that the pursuit of excellence and the realisation of distinction are within everyone's grasp.

Today the prerequisite for advancement into the 'Friendly Degree' is that the Candidate has attained the rank of Master Mason in the Craft.

The Investiture took place at Freemasons Hall on Monday, 11 December 2023, and our congratulations are extended to these Brethren on their well deserved appointments.






Maesteg Mark hold Proclamation and Elevation
