

#### Principality and Cambrensis Mark, and Royal Ark Mariners Lodge's Amalgamation

wo unique meetings were held in the Mark Province of South Wales during the middle of October 2023. On Wednesday, 18 October, Principality Mark Lodge No.1057 and Cambrensis Mark Lodge No.1528 were amalgamated, and on the following Wednesday, 25 October, the associated Royal Ark Mariner Lodges with the same names and numbers were also amalgamated. Prior to this, no Mark or RAM Lodges had been amalgamated in this Province.

Cambrensis Mark Lodge had been struggling for many years. It was reliant upon the Ritual Support Team led by WBro Philip Davies, Deputy Provincial Grand Master, to officer the Lodge. An indication of the Lodge's difficulties was that for several years WBro Paul Kelvin-Smith had been (by formal dispensation from the Provincial Grand Master) both the Treasurer and Secretary – but because of his duties as the Head of another Masonic Order he was able to attend only one of the three annual meetings.

Principality Mark Lodge had also been struggling, but not to the same extent. When it became apparent that following further resignations after the Covid pandemic, Cambrensis could no longer continue. The suggestion was made that the two Lodges should become one, a detailed review of the membership of each Lodge suggested that there would be a good 'fit' of Officers. While it is a truism that two weak Lodges will not together necessarily make a strong Lodge, an amalgamation of Principality and Cambrensis Lodges would work and would create a single Lodge that would not merely survive but thrive.

After informal discussions, an application was therefore made to the Provincial Office. The Provincial Grand Master, RWBro Eirian Jones, approved the amalgamation. Although reluctant to do so, he acknowledged that no more could be done to preserve Cambrensis Lodge, and he recognised the benefits of their Brethren remaining together as a cohort within one Lodge. Approval was given by the Grand Master so that the Ceremony of Amalgamation could take place.





The name of the amalgamated Lodge was agreed to be Principality and Cambrensis Lodge of Mark Master Masons, with the Principality number of 1057. The Amalgamation Ceremony was conducted on 18 October 2023 by the Provincial Grand Master who had extensively adapted the ritual that had been supplied by Mark Grand Lodge.

The Minutes of the last meetings of each of Principality and Cambrensis Mark Lodges were read in full by the Provincial Secretary, WBro Martin Jones, approved by the respective Brethren of each Lodge, and signed by the Senior Member of each Lodge, their signatures being witnessed by the Provincial Grand Master. At a most impressive and moving meeting RWBro Eirian Jones was supported by the entire Provincial Team who were organised by the Provincial Director of Ceremonies, WBro Richard Phillips, in his usual calm and orderly manner.

#### Pricipality and Cambrensis Lodges Amalgamation (continued)

After the two Lodges had been joined together, an Installation Ceremony was carried out by the Deputy Provincial Grand Master, WBro Philip Davies, again assisted by the Provincial Team. WBro Martin Pearson of the old Principality Mark Lodge was Installed as the First Master of the new Lodge, while the Officers were spread equally between the two former Lodges.

The amalgamated Lodge has adopted the meeting dates of Principality Mark Lodge which looks forward to welcoming many visitors as it begins its journey as a single Mark Lodge.

A Royal Ark Mariner Lodge must be 'moored' to a Mark Lodge whose number (although not necessarily its name) it will bear. Neither Principality RAM Lodge nor Cambrensis RAM Lodge had experienced the same difficulties as their respective Mark Lodges. However, two or more RAM Lodges cannot be moored to a single Mark Lodge. Thus, either Principality or Cambrensis RAM Lodge had to find another Mark Lodge to which it could be moored. When no suitable Mark Lodge could be found it was proposed that the two RAM Lodges should also amalgamate. Each Lodge agreed the proposal, which was again supported by the Provincial Grand Master and approved by the Grand Master.

It was agreed that the name and number of the amalgamated Lodge should follow that of the amalgamated Mark Lodge – hence the Principality and Cambrensis Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No.1057 was born.

There was still time for Cambrensis RAM Lodge to hold a final meeting, which took place on 11 October 2023. Appropriately, a Candidate from each Lodge was elevated – Bro Mark Mulford, a Candidate for Cambrensis RAM Lodge, and Bro Peter Hopkins, who would have been a Candidate in Principality RAM Lodge.

WBro Paul Kelvin-Smith delivered an impeccable Elevation Ceremony supported, again appropriately, by Officers from each RAM Lodge.

The amalgamation meeting for Principality RAM Lodge and Cambrensis RAM Lodge took place on 25 October 2023. It followed the same format as the amalgamation meeting of the Mark Lodges. The ritual was again rewritten and performed by the Provincial Grand Master with the assistance of his Provincial Officers. The Deputy Provincial Grand Master then conducted the Installation Ceremony. Although WBro Mat Prosser had been Installed as Worshipful Commander of Principality RAM Lodge on 3 May 2023, it was necessary for him to be Installed again in the amalgamated Lodge. The Officers whom he appointed and invested were again split between members of each of the two old Lodges.

The agreed meeting dates for the Principality and Cambrensis Lodge of Royal Ark Mariners No.1057 were those of the Cambrensis Lodge – the second Wednesday in February and October. The Installation Meeting is that in February.

In February 2024 Mat Prosser will not have been Commander of a Lodge for a full year and he will not have had an opportunity to conduct an Elevation Ceremony, so he will remain in office. He will have the surely unique distinction of within ten months being Installed twice and then Proclaimed in a Lodge having the same number!

It was an extremely hectic period while the preparations for the two amalgamations were progressing, especially during the final month or so before the meetings after the approvals from Mark Masons Hall were to hand. Particular appreciation and thanks are due to WBro Martin Jones for his support and advice – and especially his endless patience as he co-ordinated the arrangements as well as carrying out his usual duties as the Provincial Secretary.

#### Talbot Mark Appoint new Overseer

he recently appointed Overseer in Swansea's Talbot Lodge of Mark Masons is none other than WBro Richard Peltzer. Nothing unusual in that one might say but Richard was born in 1924 so that makes him the oldest Overseer in the Province.

Richard was born in Llansamlet in 1924 leaving school at fourteen to train as a stone mason. He had a narrow escape during the Swansea Blitz of 1941 when walking home from college he decided to shelter against a wall when the barber's shop window above him collapsed. That was the beginning of Richard's experience of warfare.

Aged 19 years Richard joined the Royal Engineers and after training was posted to port maintenance working on underwater demolitions. This dangerous work included

removing explosive ordnance devices and making sure ports and especially lock gates were free of German set booby traps.

He was then posted to Scotland to work on the Mulberry Harbour project in preparation for the Allied invasion of Normandy. Landing first on Gold Beach on D Day and then moving on to Juno Beach, Richards task was to clear the beach and then other ports and German military installations. Many of Richard's colleagues were lost during this period. In August 1944 Richard returned to the UK and was notified that he was being posted to Burma. However, upon arrival in India, his unit was told to remain in Kalyan

and prepare for the invasion of Singapore code named Operation Bow and Arrow. After the atom bomb was dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki this operation was aborted.

From August 1945 to May 1947, Richard was stationed in Singapore and was involved in providing 'proper' funerals for the many POWs who had lost their lives under Japanese captivity.

He remembers that the Japanese Commandant of Changi Prison would not surrender his sword to an Allied officer of a lesser rank. The officer who at the time was a Major was suddenly promoted to Brigadier to accept the sword and surrender of the Japanese Commandant. Post war Richard married Dulcie in 1947 and had a daughter Jeanette. He continued to work in construction until a fall from a great height in the 1950s left him with very serious career ending injuries. He then worked in a physically lighter occupation with schools where his skills as a photographer, honed by underwater photography during the War, were in constant demand.

In 2016 Richard was awarded the Legion d' Honneur by the French Government. In the photograph below Richard is shown to the left of WBro Alun H Thomas Assistant Provincial Grand Master.


# Special Occasion at De Cymru Lodge
